too small to see with just eyes, but very imaginable.

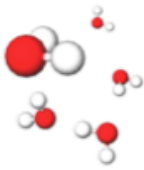
Imagine

***** As of early 2025, the Trump administration has engaged in a widespread removal of environmental, scientific, and climate data from federal websites. While specific mentions of the "Citizen Science" portal on USA.gov are not detailed in the provided reports, comprehensive deletions have impacted the White House Council of Environmental Quality***

, EPA environmental justice tools and scientific reports, suggesting that various citizen-centric science projects likely face similar removal.

Key details regarding the 2025 web removals:

Widespread Deletions: Over 8,000 web pages across numerous agencies were removed or altered shortly after the administration began.

Impacted Content: Major data removals focus on climate change, vaccines, environmental justice, and research.

Environmental Data: The Climate and Economic Justice Screening Tool (CEJST) and EPA's EJScreen were removed, affecting community access to pollution and climate risk data.

Data Preservation Efforts: Organizations like Public Environmental Data Partners are actively archiving these sites. [1, 3, 4, 5]

While some reports note that the administration has publicly stated support for certain citizen science initiatives, broader federal budget and program cuts have hindered these projects. [6]
